

MINUTES

TENNESSEE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS

January 29, 2010

A meeting for the Board of Medical Examiners was held at 10:00 a.m. in the Poplar Room, Ground Floor, 227 French Landing, Heritage Place MetroCenter, Nashville, TN.

A meeting was held to summarily suspend the medical license of Mireille Lalanne, MD on January 29, 2010.

David M. Himmelreich, Deputy General Counsel, represented the State and Dr. Lalanne was not represented nor represented by counsel. Mr. Himmelreich opened the meeting and Ms. Marsha Arnold conducted the script for a teleconference. Board members were in agreement to conduct the hearing by teleconference with Drs. Rosen and Lovelady stating they were unable to physically be present because of inclement weather.

After agreeing to proceed electronically, Mr. Himmelreich provided the members with a proposed Order of Summary Suspension. On January 11, 2010, Dr. Lalanne was convicted in the Circuit Court of Harlan County, Kentucky for facilitating trafficking in controlled substances in the first degree, committed from 2005 through November 10, 2008. The Commonwealth of Kentucky offered to dismiss all charges except the first organized crime count, to reduce the charge to facilitation of trafficking in controlled substances, and to reduce the sentence to four months of unsupervised probation the defendant would plead guilty and agree to the forfeiture of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars. Dr. Lalanne accepted the offer and entered a "best interest" plea. Nothing in the plea agreement or the judgment of conviction prohibits Dr. Lalanne from applying to the Drug Enforcement Agency to re-activate her certificate of authority to prescribe controlled substances.

Mr. Himmelreich stated Dr. Lalanne's agreement to a conviction for facilitating drug trafficking by writing prescriptions requires emergency action by the Board. He further stated that Dr. Lalanne's surrender of her DEA certificate does not adequately protect the public. After deliberation Dr. Lovelady made a motion to summarily suspend the license of Dr. Lalanne and Dr. Rosen seconded the motion. After a roll call vote the motion passed unanimously. The panel stated immediate action was needed to protect the health and welfare of the citizens of the State of Tennessee.

The response hearing was set for February 2, 2010 at 5:00 p.m.
