for Provisional License

TENNESSEE BOARD OF NURSING POLICY
REGARDING THE MULTI-STATE PRIVILEGE FOR
NURSES WHO ARE "PROVISIONALLY LICENSED" IN
KENTUCKY

It is the policy of the Tennessee Board of Nursing to recognize the multi-state privilege of any RN or LPN who holds a provisional license from the Kentucky Board of Nursing, so long as such Kentucky provisional licensee meets the following criteria:

(1) is a recent graduate of an approved nursing program; and

- (2) has passed the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) applicable to her level of practice; and
- (3) has passed a criminal background check within the preceding year.

Such Kentucky licensees may practice in Tennessee on the multi-state privilege subject to the same terms, conditions and limitations that would be placed on them were they practicing in Kentucky on the provisional license.

It is the understanding of the Tennessee Board of Nursing in promulgating this policy that a “Kentucky provisional licensee” is required by the Kentucky Board to successfully complete a one hundred twenty (120) hour internship under direct nursing supervision within six (6) months of receiving her provisional license, and that such internship entails prescribed reporting requirements.
