Dr. Martin, chair, called the meeting to order at 9:10. A sufficient number of Board members were present to constitute a quorum. Dr. Martin welcomed the Board's two new members, Dr. Jeffrey Erickson and Dr. Anita Davis.

Review/Approve April 16-17, 2008 Board Meeting Minutes

Upon review of the April 16-17, 2008 Board meeting minutes, Mr. Caye made a motion, seconded by Dr. Lavin, to approve the minutes with corrections. The motion carried.

Office of General Counsel Report

Ms. Layden introduced Mr. Christopher Larkin, who will be the Board's new advisory/litigating attorney and turned the meeting over to him to conduct an order of compliance for Mark Womack, Ph.D.

Mr. Larkin stated Dr. Womack has completed all terms of the Order issued by the Board in December 2001. The Office of General Counsel asks the Board to accept the Order of Compliance and release Dr. Womack of any further obligations.

Mr. Caye made a motion, seconded by Dr. Sigler, to release Dr. Womack as he has complied with all terms of the Board's Order. The motion carried.

Ms. Layden stated that the Board is still in the process of drafting and revising rules.

Ms. Layden stated there are currently seven (7) open cases pertaining to the Board of Examiners in Psychology.

Alison Cleaves, Deputy General Counsel addressed the Board concerning individuals practicing with an expired license and those who fail to obtain the required hours of continuing education. Ms. Cleaves stated that some boards have a three-month grace period and assess a civil penalty for licensees whose license goes into a failed to renew status. Ms. Cleaves stated this is considered disciplinary action and imposing a civil penalty is reportable. Ms. Cleaves stated that these actions would appear on the report maintained by the Department of Health. Ms. Cleaves stated that should the Board want to maintain the policy, please allow the Office of General Counsel to send the first notification of non-renewal out through a legal document (Agreed Citation) and not a demand letter. Ms. Cleaves stated the Agreed Citation would lay out the violation and the practitioner's right to a hearing and right to waive a hearing. If an Agreed Citation is issued, it will be placed in the licensee's file. The Board decided that licensees working on an expired license will pay one hundred dollars (\$100) a month for each month that they work on a lapsed license in excess of three (3) months. After discussion, Dr. Sigler made a motion, seconded by Dr. Kemp to issue the Agreed Citation to give the licensee an option to accept the Agreed Citation and waive the right to a hearing.

Ms. Cleaves spoke to the Board concerning those licensees who fail to obtain the required continuing education. After discussion, Dr. Lavin made a motion, seconded by Dr. Erickson, for practitioners not in compliance with the continuing education requirement to have three (3) months to obtain the required continuing education. If the licensee does not comply, the matter will be turned over to the Office of General Counsel for an Agreed Citation, at which time the practitioner would have to pay a one hundred dollar (\$100) civil penalty and have one year to make up the hours.

A roll call vote was conducted and all members voted aye, with the exception of one member. The motion carried. The issue of rule change will be addressed at the next scheduled Board meeting.

Conflict of Interest Policy Statement

Ms. Layden discussed the Conflict of Interest Policy Statement with the Board stating that all Board members must disclose any potential conflict of interest. If any Board member has knowledge of, or interest in, any business that comes before the Board, this must be disclosed to the Board's advisory attorney to determine if the Board member should recuse himself/herself and leave the meeting room during the proceedings.

Tennessee Colleague Assistance Foundation(TCAF)

Dr. Wind introduced Dr. Murphy Thomas. Dr. Thomas thanked the Board and staff for their assistance in entering a contract with TCAF. Dr. Thomas stated that in June of this year, the State of Tennessee awarded TCAF the contract. Dr. Thomas gave the Board an update on what TCAF has accomplished thus far. Dr. Thomas stated that Dr. Brian Wind is the executive director of TCAF. Dr. Thomas stated that TCAF has an office staffed with a secretary, a toll free number, and a web site. Dr. Thomas stated that all of the forms, the protocol and everything is in place and on the website. Dr. Thomas informed the Board that the key thing TCAF is doing now is launching an informational campaign. Dr. Thomas stated the campaign is to inform the psychological community of the services offered by TCAF. TCAF will be meeting with the intermountain psychological association, and has been in communication with the psychological association's chapter in Chattanooga, as well as trying to set a date in Memphis. Dr. Thomas stated that TCAF has started with a general information campaign to cover where TCAF came from and where TCAF is going. Dr. Thomas stated that TCAF is working not only in terms of treatment, but also in prevention. Dr. Thomas stated that it is the hope that this is going to be a first class operation from top to bottom. Dr. Thomas stated that TCAF does not have adequate monies to travel over Tennessee at the present time. Dr. Thomas informed the Board that TCAF is having a silent auction at the Tennessee Psychological Association's (TPA) annual meeting this year to raise funds. Dr. Thomas expressed his appreciation of the Board's support. Dr. Thomas introduced the Board to the executive director of TCAF, Dr. Brian Wind.

Dr. Wind stated that he would like to echo TCAF's gratitude to the Board. Dr. Wind stated that TCAF's logo is triangular and the triangle not only represents community, service and recovery, but the three areas of Tennessee – East, West and Middle. Dr. Wind stated that the Iris in the middle of the logo is Tennessee's state flower. Dr. Wind stated that one of the major functions of TCAF is the referral and monitoring process. Dr. Wind stated the website address is TCAF@online.org and will eventually be interactive. Dr. Wind reviewed the services page on the website, which outlines what TCAF does. Dr. Wind stated the resources page provides the costs, contracts available and treatment facilities. Dr. Wind said that TCAF is not actually providing psychological services, but is the "gatekeeper" and will recommend treatment facilities. Dr. Wind stated there would be links such as recovery links and different types of useful resources. Dr. Wind stated that under "contact us" on TCAF's website, their contact information is listed and there will be a confidential e-mail address added. Dr. Wind stated that TCAF's ultimate goal is to provide colleague assistance in not only Tennessee, but also other states.

Dr. Lavin stated that the Board is pleased and appreciative of TCAF's efforts.

Dr. Martin thanked Drs. Murphy and Wind.

Disciplinary Report

Ms. Stone stated there are nineteen (19) open complaints in the Office of Investigations. Ms. Stone gave the Board a breakdown of where the complaints are in the process. Ms. Stone stated one (1) was sent to screening panel; three (3) are pending second review; thirteen (13) are in the investigative field and two (2) pending first review. Ms. Stone informed the Board of the complaints regarding psychological examiners. Ms. Stone stated there are five (5) open complaints, four (4) in investigations and one (1) sent to the screening panel. Ms. Stone stated there are no open complaints pertaining to certified psychological assistants.

Disciplinary Report

Ms. Stone reviewed the list of monitored practitioners and informed the Board that she is working with the Attorney General's office should a practitioner fail to comply with the terms of any Order mandated by the Board.

Financial Report

Ms. Spitznas reviewed the financial report stating the Board has a cumulative carryover of \$339,381.22.

Dr. Martin stated she understands that the Board has been approved to pay for the reception for the annual meeting of the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards and asked Ms. Miller if the Board could attend the convention.

Ms. Miller suggested the Board choose a delegate to attend and propose that all members be approved for travel to attend. Mr. Caye stated that delegate's registration, fee and hotel is covered, and all Board members are invited to the reception at no cost, since we are hosting the reception. Mr. Caye stated due to Tennessee being the hosting state, the registration fees will be reduced. Dr. Lavin stated that since the national organization is meeting here in Tennessee, Board members are needed to provide hospitality. Ms. Miller stated since this is a national function hosted by Tennessee, more than likely it will be approved for the entire Board to attend. Dr. Sigler made a motion, seconded by Dr. Davis that Dr. Lavin be the Board's delegate. The motion carried.

Administrative Report

Ms. Spitznas reviewed the Administrative Report stating the following have been licensed or certified since April 2008: thirteen (13) psychologists, two (2) upgrades to senior psychological examiner and two (2) certified psychological assistants.

Ms. Spitznas asked the Board to encourage their colleagues to use the Department's online services. Ms. Spitznas stated that unless a Board member's travel has been approved, he or she will be responsible for any airline, hotel, or car rental reservations made.

Ms. Spitznas stated the issues to address at this meeting are as follows: welcome new board members; consider a rulemaking regarding rule 1180-2-.01(7)(d), rulemaking regarding 1180-3-.01(6); ASPPB annual meeting, schedule board meeting dates for 2009 and vote on practitioners who failed to obtain their continuing education requirement and practitioners working on a lapsed license.

Correspondence

The Board reviewed a letter from **Brynda Quinn, Ph.D.**, asking the Board if a psychologist can call himself or herself a “licensed clinical psychologist.” Mr. Caye made a motion, seconded by Ms. Hunter to table this issue until further research from the Office of General Counsel is completed.

The Board reviewed a letter from **Robert E. Huston, Ph.D.**, asking if his internship and postdoctoral experience from March 1990 can be used as part of his application in Tennessee. Mr. Caye made a motion, seconded by Dr. Davis that the Board is willing to consider Dr. Huston’s application under the reciprocity rule, should he choose to apply for licensure. The motion carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from **Bill R. Davis, Psy.D.** asking the Board to keep his application open until such time he can take the EPPP examination. Mr. Caye made a motion, seconded by Dr. Sigler to have Ms. Spitznas write Dr. Davis a letter informing him that his file is closed, but the Board will keep his transcript, internship and postdoctoral documentation and birth certificate from his old file, but he will have to reapply for licensure and pay all applicable fees. The motion carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from **Edward Latham, Ph.D.** regarding not meeting his continuing education requirement for the period 2006 – 2007. Dr. Latham did not obtain three (3) hours of ethics as outlined in the Board’s rules and regulations (1180-1-.08 (1)(e)) during 2006 – 2007, but did obtain six (6) hours of continuing education in ethics in 2008. Dr. Sigler made a motion, seconded by Mr. Caye, to accept Dr. Latham’s six (6) hours in ethics for Dr. Latham’s 2006-2007 continuing education requirement, send Dr. Latham a letter of warning, and inform him that the hours could not be divided to apply to future continuing education requirements. The motion carried.

Ms. Hunter made a motion, seconded by Mr. Caye to adjourn the meeting at 5:00 p.m. The motion carried.

August 28, 2008

Dr. Martin, chair, called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. on August 28, 2008. A sufficient number of Board members were present to constitute a quorum.

Discuss Rule Amendments

Dr. Lavin made a motion, seconded by Mr. Caye to have Rule 1180-2-.01(7) read: “Supervision by video conferencing is acceptable provided it meets the requirements of a – e above.”

The motion carried.

The Board reviewed an amendment to the rules regarding residency requirements. After discussion, Mr. Caye made a motion, seconded by Dr. Davis to leave the language in the currently proposed rule as is. The motion carried.

The Board reviewed an amendment to Rule 1180-1-.08(e) 1 – 3 regarding changing the current rule of three (3) hours of ethics from three (3) hours of ethics and the statutes to three (3) hours of ethics and/or the statutes and the most recent version of the “Ethical Standards” which are part of the “Ethical Principles and Code of Conduct” published by the American Psychological Association (A.P.A.) and approved by the A.P.A.’s Council of Representatives. The motion carried.

Dr. Martin stated there is a discrepancy in the Board’s rules regarding what practitioners can charge for patient records.

Mr. Caye made a motion, seconded by Dr. Sigler that the Board may charge reasonable costs as outlined by TCA §63-2-102(a) for the reproduction of records to third parties. The motion carried.

The Board decided to table the following issues until the next Board meeting: Forms review; ethics and jurisprudence exam; criminal background checks; letter from the ASPPB regarding Interjurisdictional Practice Certificate (IPC); letter from the International College of Professional

Psychology; and patient records. Dr. Sigler made a motion, seconded by Mr. Caye to table these issues until the next Board meeting. The motion carried.

Ms. Layden stated that what we are doing now is going through the rulemaking changes and then we will do a rulemaking hearing. When the Board is comfortable with the final version it will go to a rulemaking hearing.

The Board discussed the issue of foreign graduates. After discussion, Mr. Caye made a motion, seconded by Dr. Kemp to assemble a task force to gather information and examples from the American Psychological Association and other states regarding individuals who obtain their degree from a foreign country. Mr. Caye, Dr. Kemp and Ms. Hunter volunteered to be on the task force. Dr. Davis made a motion, seconded by Dr. Sigler to accept the volunteers of the task force. The motion carried.

The Board discussed the Tennessee Colleague Assistance Foundation (TCAF). It was noted that TCAF plans to present information concerning its services at the upcoming annual convention of the Tennessee Psychological Association (TPA). Dr. Lavin suggested that the Board could offer to support TCAF's presentation at that form by providing information about the Board's relationship to TCAF. Specifically, the Board could clarify the following three points for those in attendance. First, the Board is the one of several stakeholders supporting TCAF. While the Board's mission is different from other stakeholders, such as professional associations, areas of overlapping interest offer an opportunity for highly appropriate collaboration. Second, referrals to TCAF for evaluation and monitoring purposes are not intended to be punitive. Rather, such referrals will be made in situation in which the Board hopes to obtain the best understanding possible in regard to the behavioral health status of the referred licensee. The Board feels that basing its decision-making upon the most objective and accurate evaluation/monitoring opinion will promote our mission to protect the citizens of Tennessee. It also seems to the Board that the most accurate evaluation/monitoring opinion would be in the best interest of the licensee as well. Third, and finally, the Board feels it is important that self-referrals to TCAF anticipate receiving confidential services. The Board hopes that TCAF may never be in a position that requires report to the Board of a self-referred professional in order to protect the public. If TCAF can promote in theory, and in fact as its track record develops, that self-referrals may anticipate receiving confidential services not involving Board notification, then a new and valuable preventive component will be added to the Board's efforts at protecting the citizens of Tennessee. As Dr. Martin will not be able to attend TPA's convention this year, Dr. Lavin stated that he would be pleased to make such remarks on behalf of the Board in support of TCAF at that meeting. Dr. Sigler made a motion, seconded by Ms. Hunter for Dr. Lavin to do so. The motion carried. Dr. Lavin indicated that he will contact TCAF to extend the Board's offer in that regard.
