The Board expressed their sorrow at the untimely passing of Chairman Justin Hill. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Ms. Marcela Collins, Board Secretary.

**Conflict Of Interest**

Ms. Armstrong reviewed the Conflict of Interest Policy with the Board.

**Minutes**

Mr. Sluss made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 22, 2007 Board meeting as written. Ms. Salyers seconded the motion. The motion carried.

## **Election of Officers**

Mr. Sluss made a motion to nominate Phyllis Salyers as Chairperson. Ms. Field seconded the motion. The motion carried. Ms. Salyers made a motion to nominate Chris Sluss as Secretary. Ms. Armstrong advised the Board the motion did not require a second. The motion passed.

Ms. Salyers then began conducting the meeting.

## **Conduct a roll call vote for the rulemaking hearing held on December 18, 2007 regarding:**

- a. Practice Standards and Inspection of Establishments
- b. Establishment Licensure Process
- c. Educational Program Approval and Curriculum Requirements
- d. Application Requirements for Educational Programs
- e. Continuing Education Course Providers
- f. Fee Increases

Upon review of the comments received during the rulemaking hearing, the Board felt that they needed more time to review the proposed rules, especially those pertaining to the fee increases and application requirements for educational programs. The Board recommended holding a meeting in March, 2008 to review the proposed rules package. It was also requested that Lisa Tittle, Fiscal Director, attend the meeting to provide a cost analysis based on the proposed fee increases. Ms. Collins made a motion to table the roll call vote until after the March meeting. Ms. Field seconded the motion. The motion carried. The meeting has been scheduled for March 17, 2008.

Ms. Birkner introduced Ms. Elizabeth Miller to the Board. Ms. Miller is the newly appointed Director of Health Related Boards.

## **Applicant Interviews**

### **Amanda Lawson**

Ms. Lawson appeared before the Board to give explanation to a DUI conviction in November 2007. Ms. Smithson, Lighthouse Professional Services, advocated for Ms. Lawson. Ms. Smithson recommended Ms. Lawson remain in the Lighthouse program for one year. Mr. Sluss made a motion to grant Ms. Lawson a license and that she remain with Lighthouse for one year. Ms. Field seconded the motion. The Board was advised that if this motion passes, Ms. Lawson's license would be conditioned and reported as disciplinary action. Mr. Sluss stated that was not the intent of his motion and made a motion to amend the motion to grant Ms. Lawson a license without any conditions. Ms. Field seconded the amendment. The motion carried.

### **Francois Minani**

Mr. Sluss acknowledged that he knows Mr. Minani but that he could be unbiased in his judgment. Mr. Minani appeared before the Board to give explanation to a DUI conviction in December 2003.

Ms. Smithson of Lighthouse Professional Services advocated for Mr. Minani. Ms. Collins made a motion to approve Mr. Minani for a license. Ms. Field seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Chekanda J. Alexander

Ms. Alexander appeared before the Board in October to give explanation to an arrest of trespassing and assault. The case was scheduled to go to trial in January 2008. At the October meeting the Board referred Ms. Alexander to Lighthouse Professional Services and deferred action until the February meeting. Ms. Smithson of Lighthouse Professional Services advocated for Ms. Alexander. Ms. Collins made a motion to approve Ms. Alexander for a license. Ms. Field seconded the motion. The motion carried.

**Adverse Licensure Conditions**

Julie Lynn Dunlap

Ms. Dunlap was issued a conditional license on November 13, 2006. The Board mandated that she be monitored by Lighthouse Professional Services for one year. Ms. Dunlap appeared before the Board in October 2007. Upon receipt of a letter from Lighthouse Professional Services, stating that Ms. Dunlap has completed the program, she would be granted an unrestricted license. It was brought to the attention of Board staff, by the Office of Investigations, that Ms. Dunlap did not submit an Order of Compliance; therefore, Ms. Dunlap appeared before the Board again at this meeting, to present the Order of Compliance. Ms. Smithson addressed the Board concerning the Adverse Action flag placed on Ms. Dunlap's license and explained it was not the intent in 2006 that Ms. Dunlap's license be disciplined and that it was a misunderstanding of the wording. Ms. Salyers stated it was not the intent of the Board to discipline this license and asked Ms. Armstrong if the conditions and disciplinary flag could be removed from this file. Ms. Armstrong advised the Board not to change the status of this file. Ms. Smithson stated it was also a misunderstanding of the legal effect the conditional license would have and that she would have never recommended this license to be conditioned had it been explained it would be considered a disciplinary action.

Ms. Juanita Stone, Disciplinary Coordinator, addressed the Board to confirm that Ms. Dunlap has met the conditions that the Board imposed in November 2006. Ms. Field made a motion to accept the Order of Compliance. Ms. Collins seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Ms. Birkner further reported that effective October 29, 2007, Wright Travel was awarded the new contract for state travel agency services. She also informed the Board that travel claims and per diem forms will now be submitted for payment only once a month. She stated that staff is once again working a register to hire a new licensure technician.

**Establishment Inspection Report**

Ms. Birkner reported there were seventy-three (73) inspections conducted during the period of October 2007 thru January 2008 in the East Tennessee region. She further reported that the new contracts have been awarded and the anticipated contract term will be February 19, 2008 through February 18, 2011. The cost per inspections for the new contracts will be \$75.00 for Middle Tennessee, and \$98.00 for East and West Tennessee. She suggested the Board consider the new cost per inspections as they discuss the proposed rules.

**The following deficiencies were cited in East Tennessee:**

**October:**

- 1 establishment received a single deficiency for not having a licensed massage therapist
- 1 establishment received a single deficiency for not having a fire extinguisher

**November:**

- 1 establishment received a single deficiency for not having a licensed massage therapist
- 1 establishment received a single deficiency for not having hot water

**December:**

- 2 establishments received a single deficiency for not having a smoke detector
- 1 establishment received a single deficiency for the massage therapist's license being expired

**January:**

No deficiencies were cited

**Investigation/Disciplinary Report**

Ms. Juanita Stone, Disciplinary Coordinator, Office of Investigations, reported there are a total of fourteen (14) open complaints for massage therapists and establishments. She further reported that from January 2007 through December 2007, twenty-five (25) new complaints have been received. Of those complaints, twelve (12) had been closed with no action, two (2) were closed with a letter of concern, two (2) with a letter of warning and five (5) were referred to the Office of General Counsel.

**Financial Report**

The Board reviewed the financial report. No questions were asked.

**Office of General Counsel Report**

Ms. Armstrong reported the following:

**Rules:**

1. Continuing education approval, use of titles, peer assistance program approval (Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. 0870-1-.03, -.12; 0870-2-.02) These amendments went to rulemaking hearing on April 17, 2007. They were approved by the Board on May 7, 2007. They were sent to the Attorney General for review on June 22, 2007, where they remain today.

2. Fee increases, examinations, standards and schools (0870-1-.01, -.02, -.04 to -.06, -.08, -.09, -.14, -.15, -.19; 0870-2-.02, -.03, -.05 to -.09) These amendments went to rulemaking on December 18, 2007. As discussed today, these rules will be discussed in the special call meeting in March.

### **Litigation:**

The Office of General Counsel, Tennessee Department of Health, currently has seven (7) open cases pertaining to the Massage Licensure Board.

### **Review and Discuss Legislation**

Ms. Armstrong reported there are three pieces of legislation that affect this Board: to extend the Board to 2011; to extend the term of Board members; and the ability to charge a fee for course approval.

### **Review Applicant Files**

#### Lisa Marie Francis

Ms. Francis' file was reviewed by the Board because she has been unable to have a complete transcript submitted indicating the number of hours taken in specific subjects. Ms. Francis does not meet the reciprocity requirements because she is not nationally certified. Mr. Sluss suggested Ms. Francis try to obtain a copy of the rules from Florida which were in effect when she received her license. Ms. Collins made a motion to allow Ms. Francis sixty (60) more days to provide adequate information pertaining to her education. Mr. Sluss seconded the motion. The motion carried.

### **Receive Report from the Federation of Associations of Regulatory Boards' Annual Meeting**

Ms. Collins attended the meeting held January 25-27, 2008 in Santa Fe, New Mexico. She reported the meetings focus was on confidentiality and open meetings with sessions on a legislator's perspective, alternative dispute resolutions, exam breaches, and top recent regulatory cases. Other topics that were covered included post-discipline board enforcement, and new legislation impacting regulatory boards. The workshop was facilitated by Dale Atkinson, Executive Director of FARB. Ms. Collins informed the Board that Mr. Atkinson offered to visit the State Boards and conduct a free Board member training session. Ms. Armstrong advised the Board they would need to obtain approval from the HRB Director prior to inviting Mr. Atkins. Mr. Sluss made a motion to request that staff contact Mr. Atkinson and ask if he could attend an upcoming meeting to provide board member training. Ms. Field seconded the motion. The motion carried.

### **Receive Annual Report from Lighthouse Professional Services**

Ms. Smithson presented the annual report for Lighthouse Professional Services which provided a breakdown of activities and costs from November 14, 2003 through December 31, 2007. Ms. Smithson also reported that Lighthouse Professional Services was audited by the Department of Health on May 23, 2007 and the only findings were that two financial reports were late.

### **Approve Grant for Peer Assistance Program**

Ms. Smithson presented the proposed grant for the period of July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009. The Scope of Services, as presented, reads:

#### A. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

The Grantee shall provide:

1. Prevention, referral, and monitoring services to massage therapy personnel who are impaired, or are in danger of becoming impaired, due to chemical abuse, addictions, or psychosocial, emotional, and/or mental conditions or impairments, and
2. Diversion and advocacy services for individuals who have violated, or are in danger of violating, the Massage Therapy Practice Act, and who have not had formal disciplinary action taken against their license, and
3. Educational and awareness services, and
4. Consultation services to massage schools, massage establishment owners, and/or individuals regarding services described herein, and
5. Pre-licensure assessment of substance abuse, convictions, criminal histories, or other problematic indications identified during pre-licensure review by the Board or the state's administrative staff, and
6. Services to the following categories of individuals:
  - (1) Individuals with no history of disciplinary action by the Tennessee Massage Licensure Board,
  - (2) Licensed massage therapists who have been ordered by the Tennessee Massage Licensure Board to participate in the program,
  - (3) Individuals seeking licensure by the Tennessee Massage Licensure Board whose participation in the program benefits the potential licensee, the licensure process, and the Board's approval process, and
7. A program operated in accordance with written policies and procedures and in compliance with all state and federal laws that insure the proper and legal administration of the program and the welfare of the individuals served, and

8. A program that complies with all applicable confidentiality laws and regulations as defined in 42 U.S.C. § 290dd-2 and its accompanying regulations, 42 C.F.R., Part 2, and TCA 10-7-504(a) & (h) and TCA 63-1-136(d), and applicable requirements of the Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), and
9. Reporting and other services necessary in accomplishing the tasks described herein or as requested by the Massage Licensure Board.

B. GRANT CONTRACT TERM:

- B.1. Grant Contract Term. This Grant Contract shall be effective for the period commencing on July 1, 2008 and ending on June 30, 2009. The State shall have no obligation for services rendered by the Grantee which are not performed within the specified period.
- B.2. Term Extension. The State reserves the right to extend this Grant contract for an additional period or periods of time representing increments of no more than one year and a total contract term of no more than five (5) years, provided that the State notifies the Grantee in writing of its intention to do so prior to the Grant Contract expiration date. An extension of the term of this Grant contract will be effected through an amendment to the Grant Contract. If the extension of the Grant Contract necessitates additional funding beyond that which was included in the original Grant contract, the increase in the State's maximum liability will also be effected through an amendment to the Grant Contract.

C. PAYMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- C.1. Maximum Liability. In no event shall the maximum liability of the State under this Grant Contract exceed ninety-three thousand five hundred dollars (\$93,500). The Grant Budget, attached and incorporated herein as a part of this Grant Contract as Attachment 1, shall constitute the maximum amount due the Grantee for the service and all of the Grantee's obligations hereunder. The Grant budget line-items include, but are not limited to, all applicable taxes, fees, overhead, and all other direct and indirect costs incurred or to be incurred by the Grantee.

Ms. Collins made a motion to approve the Scope of Service as presented with the grant proposal. Mr. Sluss seconded the motion. The motion carried. Ms. Collins made motion to amend the previous motion to include the contract grant amount of ninety-three thousand five hundred dollars (\$93,500). Mr. Sluss seconded the amendment. The motion carried.

## **Board Correspondence**

### **Letter Concerning Journies Hands Free Massage**

Ms. Becky Arrants, Co-Owner of Journies Hands Free Massage, was present along with Attorney, Mr. Myers Morton. A letter and brochure was received from Patricia Weaver, requesting clarification if Journies, providing hands free massage, would require a therapist or establishment license. Ms. Collins expressed concern that the word massage was used fourteen (14) times in the brochure. Ms. Arrants presented the Board with a revised brochure, in which the name of the company had been changed to Journies Relaxation Spa and the word massage was changed to relaxation throughout the brochure. Ms. Armstrong advised the Board that there is nothing in the rules that does or does not exempt them from licensure and advised them not to issue such a letter. She further recommended that representatives from Journies file a petition for a declaratory order. Ms. Salyers stated the Board does not have any jurisdiction over this type of service. No further action was taken.

### **Letter from Neal Sanders, Steiner American Cruises**

The Board reviewed a letter from Neal Sanders, Director of Spa Operations, Steiner American Cruises stating that the cruise ship might possibly be docking in Tennessee, and that they provide massage therapy services to the ships passengers and crew only. Mr. Neal is requesting clarification as to whether the massage therapist(s) would need to hold a Tennessee massage license. Ms. Salyers stated the Tennessee Massage Practice Act does not specifically address this nor Maritime law. No action was taken.

## **Ratifications**

Ms. Field made a motion to ratify all new and reinstated licenses for massage therapists and massage establishments issued from October 6, 2007 through January 24, 2008. Mr. Sluss seconded the motion. The motion carried.
